The year 2019 is the last year of Heisei era in Japan. As many of you may know, Japan counts years using a system of an imperial reign period, and currently we are in Heisei (平 成) era. Heisei era began with Emperor Akihito's succession from his father Emperor Hirohito's passing in 1989. During the 30 years of Heisei era, so many incidents happened. The examples of recent incidents are the Kumamoto earthquakes, super heavy rain, typhoons; floods in many parts of Japan, the great Tohoku (east Japan) earthquakes and nuclear power plant meltdown. The 2007-2008 economic collapse is still fresh in our minds. The fall of the Berlin Wall, Gulf War, Soviet collapse are some occurrences of the Heisei era. The last 30 years, the Emperor Akihito and Empress Michiko prayed for the peace, security and order of

the world everyday. The emperor's days start off with the ritual of morning prayer for the nation. ### **BUDDHISM LESSON 101**

On December 18th last year, the students of Mr. Yashiro and Ms. Uehara's classes attended the Buddhism seminar for the first time. They learned the meaning of "religion" and "truth".
