Looking back over the past year, I am happy to see that each child has grown a lot at one's own pace. Some children who were bewildered in the new environment at the beginning of September now seem to be very comfortable and lively. In the two-year-old classrooms, the children sing songs in a joyful manner as their teacher plays piano or listen with a serious look as their teacher reads from books or picture story cards. In the three-year-old classrooms, the children are confident of being helpers, and they role play and act responsibly. In the four-year-old classrooms, the children create their own play and solve problems by themselves. The children in the Saturday class (three-year-old and four-year-old are combined) also put a sticker of "Helper" on their chest and role play as well as do a lot of creative play.

Our staff is appreciative that some of the children who graduate from our preschool subsequently enroll in the Gardena Buddhist Church Japanese School to learn Japanese. They keep studying through Kindergarten, elementary, middle, and high schools with similar expressions as when at Nakayoshi Preschool. We are moved by their dedication. We hope that your child continues to study Japanese after he/she graduates from our preschool. To the parents/guardians of the graduating children, we have appreciated your past understanding and cooperation. To the parents/guardians whose children will return next year, we will continue to support your child's healthy development.

Daily 2-year-old classrooms
